

## White Fox SCC Meeting Minutes November 24, 2025

**Meeting Location** - White Fox School

**Invitees** - Melissa McFarlane, Jaime Fyfe, Monica Wismer, Heidi Rudy, Danielle Tatlow, Jamie Kearney and Kristie Long. A post also went out on Edsby inviting new members.

**Present** - Melissa McFarlane, Jackie Wandler, Amy Nicklefork, Chelsea Corrigan, and Kristie Long. Guests were Jaime Fyfe, Monica Wismer, Danielle Tatlow and Shannon Kempin.

**Adoption of the Agenda** - Chelsea made a motion to adopt the agenda as presented. Kristie seconded the motion. Approved

**Approval of Minutes** - Monica made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 28, 2025 meeting as presented. Kristie seconded the motion. Approved

**Treasurer's Report** - Bank balance is \$2,104.44. There are no outstanding bills to pay. Chelsea made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Amy seconded the motion. Approved

**School Report** - See attached. 81 students, currently no staff changes. D. Fehr who is on maternity leave and was to return in January has resigned. The SRC is busy, they attended a leadership conference and they are planning Christmas activities. Basketball has started and curling will start December 1. This year's Christmas Concert will be on December 17. The poinsettias from the plant fundraiser will be arriving this week. The wrapping paper and poinsettias fundraiser was \$800 profit each. The ham for the Ham Lunch has been ordered, the Ham Lunch will be on December 19 and the school would like to make this a community event. The school would like a list of people in the community needing a lunch meal delivered to them on December 19. Kristie will provide a list of people in the community that are needing a meal. This year the students will help with some of the meal. Grade 7 is scheduled to help out. Any activities planned during learning hours has to be paid for by the school. The SRC would pay for any activities outside of learning time. We discussed that the ski trip and if it was scheduled on learning time the cost would have to come out of the school budget but if it was planned out of learning time the SCC would have to pay for it. A \$30,000 grant was awarded to the school for school improvements. The money will be used for Sydney Dabek's room, some money per classroom and money to be used for reading intervention. We talked about a parent/child reading book club. A survey will be sent out shortly asking for parent volunteers to help out with different school activities. Kristie made a motion to approve the School Report as presented. Shannon seconded the motion. Approved

**New Business** - The new SCC decided on the positions they would hold. Kristie Long - President, Matt Hordos - Vice President, Heidi Rudy - Treasurer, Chelsea Corrigan - Secretary and Amy Nicklefork will be the Member at Large.

Kristie made a motion to remove Jaime Fyfe from the SCC's signing authority. Members to be added to the signing authority for the SCC are Matt Hordos, Chelsea Corrigan and Amy Nicklefork. Monica seconded the motion. Approved.

The Christmas Store will be held the morning of Friday December 19.

Jaime made a motion that the SCC will supply cookies for the staff and students on December 18. Kristie seconded the motion. Approved

Chelsea presented a playground grant that is for schools only. The grant will match up to a maximum of \$50,000 for new playground equipment. The grant is not a guaranteed match because once the funds run out they do not get replenished until the next time the grant is available.

Next Meeting - Jaime adjourned the meeting at 6:30. The next meeting will be held January 19, 2025 at 5:00 at the school.

## School Report

School attendance remains steady at 81 students with no staffing changes. SRC activities have included spirit days, the Halloween parade and carnival, and Remembrance Day, with students also attending the SRC Leadership Conference in Nipawin. Planning is underway for Christmas events, including the Christmas Concert on Dec. 17, ham lunch on Dec. 19, and poinsettia delivery on Thursday. Basketball practices began last week, and curling starts Dec. 1. The Our School Survey has been completed by Grades 4–9, and results will be shared with the SCC. Administration also discussed budget considerations around curricular vs. year-end field trips and moving toward more authentic, year-round learning experiences.

Teachers continue work connected to Rtl, reading intervention, transitions, and self-regulation. The school received a \$30,000 Teacher Innovation Grant, with \$10,000 directed to reading intervention materials and \$20,000 to support self-regulation initiatives. During the Nov. 10 SIP Day, staff collaborated with other schools on curriculum-focused assessment work and took part in an equity workshop titled *Just a Child in Canada*. Innovation Sprints continue, with teachers observing and video-recording in each other's classrooms and providing feedback centred on grade-level expectations, student progress, and next steps for learning.
