### b. Principal's Report

- Student Enrolment remains steady at 81 students.
- Staffing updates include coverage Ms. McFarlane teaching in the K/1 classroom in the afternoons, Miss LeCuyer working mornings, and Sydney Dabek returning from mat leave on January 26 as Diversity Education Teacher and Classroom Complexity Teacher.
- December was very busy with skating with the Hawks, our poinsettia and gift wrap fundraisers, the Christmas concert, Christmas hampers totaling \$450, and a ham lunch.
- The SRC led a fun Christmas spirit week and is now preparing for Valentine's activities and supporting Telemiracle.
- Our Universal Snack Program runs Monday mornings for all students and is organized by our outreach worker and a Grade 8/9 student.
- Basketball is underway (we are hosting this Thursday), we have three curling teams, and our Curling Bonspiel will take place February 12–13 with parent volunteers helping in the booth.
- We also reviewed bus safety and morning drop-off procedures.
- We are focusing on "Living Our Expectations" in January, recognizing students who show they are safe, kind, and responsible.
- We have started spending our \$30,000 grant, including about \$8,000 on decodable books and literacy resources.
- Beginning in February, self-regulation will be a school-wide focus, led by Mrs. Dabek, as we know students need to be regulated in order to learn.
- Teachers are preparing report cards and ensuring that any "MM" or "NY" marks include clear explanations and that learning stories clearly describe student progress.
- Megan Lecuyer has expressed interest in offering construction classes this spring. Lecuyer Welding has generously offered to donate metal legs for picnic tables as part of the program.
- Recess scheduling continues to present challenges for Grades 8 and 9 students. Administration is working collaboratively with students to find a solution that accommodates all grade levels effectively.

### 7. New Business

- Bonspiel: Initial discussion regarding organizing teams and event planning.
